Wilmer "Cowboy" Little May 1, 1935 - July 3, 2016

If you ever attended the Southwest Fiddlers Championship contest in Groesbeck, Texas then you would have seen Cowboy. He founded the contest 48 years ago and served as its announcer. He is described in a 2008 Houston Chronicle newspaper article as the heart of the contest, and without him, there would very likely be no fiddle contest in Groesbeck. His enthusiasm and love for fiddling was always appreciated, and he will be missed.

Contest News

Johnson County Pioneers and Old Settlers Reunion Fiddle Contest, Alvarado, TX

The next contest on the TOTFA schedule will be September 9. The Johnson County Pioneers and Old Settlers Reunion was first held in 1893, so that means this year's will be the 124th annual. In that time, according to organizer Rocky Biggs, there have been over 100 fiddle contests associated with this 4-day event.

This year the contest will start at Friday evening at 7 p.m. That's one hour earlier than in previous years, and will kick off with the senior division. This will be the 2^{nd} year that TOTFA has worked in partnership

with the county association, and all our members are encouraged to attend this historic contest. Thanks to an anonymous donation, an additional \$250 will be paid out in the 0-15 age division to let the youngsters know how much they are appreciated! The divisions and projected payouts are listed later in this newsletter.

34th Annual J. Box Roberts Memorial Fiddle Contest, Seguin, TX

Organizer Jesse Roy Hart announces that there is additional prize money to be awarded this year. The grand championship division, which is the 1st place winner from each fiddle division, will pay \$500 to the Grand Champion (1st place) and \$300 to the Reserve Grand Champion (2nd place). Accompanist prize money has also been increased to \$200 for 1st place and \$150 for 2nd place.
